Guidance on the Use of Photography



The Church only has responsibility for safeguarding and the use of photography if it plans to use the photographs for Church purposes. Photographs taken at events

organised by family and schools such as Communions, weddings or Confirmations (including when the photographer is employed by the school or family for these occasions) do not fall under the responsibility of the Church, unless they are being taken for Church purposes.

If parents/guardians and parishioners are intending to photograph or video at an organised event, they should also be made aware of what is permitted and what is not.

Review of Safeguarding Practice

In order to ensure that we meet the best possible practice of safeguarding in our Diocese, I intend inviting the National Board for Safeguarding Children in the Catholic Church (NBSCCCI) to undertake an audit of the Diocese. I envisage this will take place sometime this year. This will involve a team of independent auditors examining all aspects of diocesan involvement with children and looking at how we respond to safeguarding issues.

Garda Vetting – and remember re-vetting is every 3 years

It is **unlawful** for anyone to enable or permit any person to be engaged in relevant activities with children or vulnerable persons without their being subject to Garda Vetting. Do not assume that others have made

Visiting Clergy

The Diocese of Raphoe warmly welcomes all visiting Clergy wishing to take part in public ministry. Bishops, Priests and Deacons are required, on request, to produce a valid Celebret. Anyone arranging or facilitating a visiting priest to be involved in public ministry must ensure that the visiting priest:


- Has permission to be involved in such ministry from the Bishop
- Is Garda Vetted
- Has attended Safeguarding Training
- Holds a valid Celebret
